The National Bowhunter Education Foundation (NBEF) would like to cordially invite you to attend a *Tree Stand Safety Instructors Course* held in conjunction with the Pope and Young Convention, Wednesday, *April 22, 2008 in Denver, CO*. Over two hundred individuals from numerous states and several foreign countries have been certified since the inception of this course in mid 2006. *You do not have to be a hunter ed or bowhunter ed instructor to take this course.*



We are all aware that tree stand incidents are rapidly on the increase and have the potential to scar the image of hunting. This course is designed to provide up-to-date information about reducing risks in the specific area of elevated stand usage. The National Bowhunter Education Foundation is proud to be the administrative agency for this grand project which is being accomplished in coordination with the Treestand Manufacturers Association, AWP inc., and other associated professionals in the field of tree stand safety.

Be prepared for a full day of learning which includes classroom as well as field activities that will give you the tools to train others in the arena of tree stand safety or knowledge you can use while teaching hunter ed or bowhunter ed classes. But perhaps most importantly you will want to utilize the information in your personal life while hunting!

Due to the “hands on” nature of the certification process, the *class is limited to 25 individuals*. An entrance fee of \$30.00 is payable via credit card when you register for the class. The \$30.00 fee includes a notebook with printed curriculum and PowerPoint CD, the latest NBEF Safe Treestand Strategies DVD, a copy of “*Today’s 3-in-1 Responsibility Guide*”, a copy of the Treestand Safety Guidelines by the TMA, a patch, and a Certificate of Completion.
